## A Letter From The President

Chihuahua & Small Dog Rescue, Inc. is celebrating it's fourth year as a rescue group and 501 (3)(c). In our short four years of rescuing small dogs, we have come a very long way. We started out with three people and almost immediately we were down to two volunteers. It took time and many mistakes, but we grew, becoming a strong and well known organization in the state of Colorado. My initial vision of Chihuahua & Small Dog Rescue was a small group of people helping a few little ones each year. I knew there was a need to help small dogs in the state, but never knew the real need. By the time we came to our first anniversary, we had rescued 100 little ones

and had 20 volunteers. I didn't think when I started out that we would rescue 100 in our first year.

Here we are at year four. We were very excited in February 2009 that we reached 500 rescues. That was a mile marker that four years ago I thought we would reach in about 10 years. In September we rescued our 600th little one. We lost a few along the way due to quality of life, but no matter what was wrong with a little one that we took in, their medical was taken care of. We have rescued numerous little ones with broken leas, little ones that have been hit by a car and a whole range of medical issues. We have never turned

away a little one because of their medical needs. The only time we turn little ones away is if we do not have the room. It always breaks my heart whenever I have to say no to a shelter because we don't have a spot for a little one in need. Unfortunately, when we have to say no, I very much know what the outcome of that little one will be.

As with any rescue group, we are always in need of foster homes and volunteers. We do not have a facility for our little ones that we rescue. Each one goes into a foster home to be cared for, taught doggy manners and get them house trained. When we get little ones in that need major surgery,

there is a long rehabilitation time for them and when this happens our foster home now becomes unavailable for a long period of time. A broken leg will take 8 to 12 weeks to heal and in some cases longer, because our little one may need a second surgery. But, we do not turn away this little one because he/she will be with us for a long period of time, we still take the little one and get them healed and ready for their forever home.

All that we have accomplished over the last 4 years would not have happened without the help and dedication of our volunteers. Even with their busy lives, they have all opened




